Behavioral Health Advisory Committee Roles & Responsibilities

Region V Systems is a political subdivision of the state of Nebraska, as identified in the Nebraska Behavioral Health Services Act, Nebraska Rev. Statutes 71-801 to 71-820. Region V shall establish and utilize a regional advisory committee to carry out its duties as identified in state statutes. For Region V, this advisory committee has been named the "Behavioral Health Advisory Committee."

Since 1974, the mission of Region V Systems is to encourage and support the provision of a full range of mental health, alcoholism, and drug abuse programs and services to the youth and adults in southeast Nebraska. Specifically, Region V monitors services and provides program, fiscal, and technical assistance to certified and licensed public and private service providers. The planning for and provision of services by Region V and its affiliate providers will be "client-centered" and keep as its focus the provision of services which are community-based and individualized to meet the needs of the client and his or her family.

Who is the BHAC?

The Behavioral Health Advisory Committee (BHAC) is comprised of 15-20 members; at least 50 percent of the members represent the rural counties of southeast Nebraska (the remainder represent Lancaster County). The rural counties include: Butler, Fillmore, Gage, Jefferson, Johnson, Nemaha, Otoe, Pawnee, Polk, Richardson, Saline, Saunders, Seward, Thayer, and York. Consideration for membership is given to geographic location, direct and indirect consumers, cultural diversification, and the community at large. Persons who receive remuneration from a Region V-funded agency are not eligible to serve on this committee.

What are the BHAC's roles and responsibilities?

The BHAC is responsible for advising the Regional Governing Board on behavioral health issues (mental health and substance abuse) and funding allocations, which total approximately \$23 million annually. The BHAC:

	Is responsible for the development of goals and objectives, which set the direction of the Region.
	Reviews agency budget requests pertaining to the delivery of mental health and substance abuse services.
□	Is involved in studies regarding present services or the need for behavioral health services.
	Provides the Regional Governing Board information regarding the needs of the programs in their individual county.
□	Is an advocate for behavioral health services in Region V and the state.
	Is a conduit for information from the community to the Regional Governing Board.

How often does the BHAC meet?

A calendar of scheduled meetings is set for the year, with meetings held on Wednesdays (9:00 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.) in Lincoln, approximately seven times per year. Members must attend at least one-half of the regular and special meetings held by the BHAC during any one-year period. Committee members may also be asked to serve on various subcommittees throughout the year.

How long is a term of service?

A term of service is three years. Members shall not serve more than three consecutive, three-year terms.
